Important things to know

HAMMANSKRAAL COMMUNITY IMBIZO

The Executive Mayor of Tshwane, Ald Cilliers Brink, together with the Speaker of Council, Cllr Mncedi Ndzwanana and other political principals, will host a community imbizo in Hammanskraal on Saturday, 17 August 2024, to provide progress updates on the work to bring clean potable water to residents.

The imbizo will outline progress on various components of key projects at Rooiwal Wastewater Treatment Plant and Magalies Water Package Plant that is set to provide tap water in September. There'll also be an update on the issue of historical debt of audited meters.

IMPROVING STREET LIGHTS REPAIRS

This week, City teams revisited Region 4 for the Urban Management Plan. Roadside cleaning, pothole and street light repairs were done in Cantonments Road in Lyttelton and in Olievenhoutbosch, Wards 77 and 106. The City continues to prioritise street lights. In just two weeks in August, teams fixed 600 street lights in Region 4. More street light repairs will be rolled out to various regions in Tshwane.

WASTE COLLECTION CATCH-UP PLAN IN REGION 6

The City of Tshwane is implementing a waste collection catch-up plan in parts of Region 6. This follows disruptions by disgruntled former refuse service providers. The normal waste collection schedule has been severely impacted in Region 6 since the introduction of the new waste management service providers on 15 July 2024.

The City remains committed to providing efficient waste management services and will not give in to acts of intimidation.

MAMELODI R4 RESERVOIR WATER LEVELS INCREASE SIGNIFICANTLY

Following the closure of the Mamelodi R4 reservoir to facilitate repairs on a damaged valve, the City is pleased to report that water levels have surpassed the 80% mark.

This milestone is a major achievement, as this is the first time that the Mamelodi R4 reservoir has reached this level since the current administration took office. The City continues to dismantle illegal water connections which contribute to excessive consumption.

DEPUTY MAYOR

On 14 August 2024, the City, in partnership with the Tshwane University of Technology, held a successful Women in Innovation and Leadership Dialogue as part of the Women's Month commemorations.

Female leaders in the private sector and government engaged on wide-ranging issues relate to empowering women to enable their participation in the innovation space.

Discussions were also conducted with scientists, social workers and policy-makers on how they navigate challenges in their professional lives.

The Deputy Mayor, Cllr Nasiphi Moya, stressed the importance of gender equality. Cllr Moya maintained that support for women needs systematic changes that are spearheaded by the government and that South Africa requires comprehensive policies that address the systemic barriers that hinder women's empowerment.
