### CITY FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The City of Tshwane has duly complied and submitted its financial statements for the 2023/24 financial year to the Auditor-General of South Africa on time.

The statements went through many checks and balances to ensure compliance. The City is confident that the statements are in good order and will improve our audit outcome.

This administration remains committed to the financial stability of the City and ensuring that we comply with all relevant local government financial requirements.

### PUBLIC OUTREACH MEETING IN HAMMANSKRAAL

The City of Tshwane will hold another public meeting in Hammanskraal on 7 September 2024 to provide the latest updates on the provision of water in the area.

Residents will get an opportunity to get answers on the upcoming launch of Klipdrift Water Treatment Plant set to be operational by October 2024.

### LIGHTING UP OUR STREETS

This week, the City's Urban Management Programme hit Francis Baard Street and other areas in Region 3 to repair street lights and provide other services, including tree pruning and garbage collection. **553** street lights were attended to and **329** street lights were successfully repaired.

From 15 July 2024 to date, Region 3 has fixed over **4 000** street lights, predominantly in the inner city.

Public lighting is one of the key priorities of this administration and we are fully committed to increasing illumination levels across Tshwane.

### SOSHANGUVE JJ 132 KV OVERHEAD POWER LINE

This week, the Executive Mayor and the MMC for Utilities visited Soshanguve where a project to connect the new JJ Substation to the existing 132 kV grid is underway to address frequent power supply interruptions in the Soshanguve area.

This will ensure a more stable and reliable electricity supply to key areas in Soshanguve.

### TMPD LAW ENFORCEMENT

The City of Tshwane has established a task team that will focus on crime hotspot areas in Soshanguve and Jukulyyn.

This week, the Tshwane Metro Police Department (TMPD) Jukulyyn task team arrested four individuals for possession of an unlicensed 9 mm firearm with its serial number filed off as well as ammunition. All suspects have been arrested and are being detained in police custody.

Officers also recovered two hijacked vehicles in two different areas of Mabopane and Winterveld with no suspects. The matter is under investigation.

In a separate incident, TMPD Drug Unit members intercepted a Nigerian national drug dealer and his girlfriend in Soshanguve on their way to make a drop off. 500 heroin packets with an estimated street value of R20 000 were found on them. The suspects were arrested and are being detained at a local police station.
