PRETORIA WEST HOUSING PROJECT LAUNCHED

This week, the MMC for Housing and Human Settlements, Ald Aaron Maluleka, launched the Andeon Ext 37 project in Pretoria West.

This project will create 1 111 housing opportunities and provide 1 113 serviced stands equipped with essential bulk and reticulation for water and sewer services.

A major component of the Andeon project involves the relocation of informal settlements, specifically those in Gomora, Melusi and Atteridgeville, into these serviced stands.

By providing proper infrastructure and housing, the City is taking a vital step towards ensuring that vulnerable communities have access to safe and secure living environments.
